

Guidance on types of questions

Question type	
Drag & drop onto image	<p>This question type requires you to drag words, images or both from a list that appears below the base image and drop them into pre-defined gaps on the base image.</p> <p>If you feel you may have made a mistake, you can drag the words or images to a different gap, or just move them back to the area below the base image.</p>
Embedded answers (CLOZE)	<p>A Cloze Question provides you with text that has certain words missing from it. You are expected to fill the blanks with the right word or words.</p> <p>In this type of question, you must be particularly careful with your spelling of the words you fill in.</p> <p>You can use the TAB or ENTER keys to move to the next gap. When you have filled in all the gaps, move on to the next question.</p>
Matching	<p>Matching questions have a content area and a list of statements which you must correctly match against another list of statements.</p> <p>For example, you may be asked to 'Identify the MOST COMMON general uses of gas and pipeline installations for each of the following gasses'.</p> <p>For each statement, select the answer that you consider to be correct.</p> <p>It is possible to have more answers than the number of questions. In these cases, be careful when making your choices – you can't find the correct answers by elimination.</p>
Multiple choice	<p>This question type will ask a question that requires you to select the current answer.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make sure you understand what each multiple choice question is asking • Evaluate each answer to the multiple choice question • Eliminate each clearly wrong answer • Select the answer that you consider to be correct. <p>Some questions may ask you to tick all that apply. In these cases, there will be more than one correct answer. You MUST select only those answers that you think are correct. You will be penalised if you select an answer that is wrong! (You can't just tick all the answers.)</p>

Ordering	<p>Ordering questions require you to arrange a series of items into a correct sequence or order. To move an item, simply hover over the item, then click and drag it to a new position. Other items will move out of the way to make space.</p> <p>Take care with ordering questions with only a few choices – these may already be in the correct order!</p>
True/False	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Read the questions carefully, as it's not uncommon to have just one word make the difference as to whether the statement is correct or not• Dissect the statement word-by-word and phrase-by-phrase• Look for inflexible words• Don't become confused by negatives• Pay attention to negative words and prefixes (such as un, non, etc.) that impact the meaning of a statement• Select the answer that you consider to be correct
